grew up as an Adventist, faithfully attending Sabbath School lessons as a child. But as I got older, became discouraged inconsistencies I saw in others at church. Slowly, I drifted away. I stopped attending services, and soon I was drinking, smoking, engaging in casual sex, and living without any day of worship. While I still avoided certain foods, I had already consumed things I once considered abominable. Deep inside, I still believed in God-but there was no relationship, no connection. I justified my choices, even when I knew they were wrong, both morally and spiritually.

One day, missionaries came to my door with a simple survey: was I willing to listen to God's Word in a seminar? Hesitant but curious, I agreed. The topics, especially The Fall of Babylon stirred questions I had carried for years. Through the seminar and personal Bible studies, I finally found clarity. I realized that faith without love cannot sustain true obedience, and without love, there is no genuine repentance. I had known the facts of faith since childhood, but only after walking through sin and brokenness did I understand how great a sinner I truly was—and how much greater God's love is.

Days before the seminar ended, I quit smoking. For years I had been a chain smoker, but when I chose to follow Jesus, I understood that His blood had bought me freedom. Through His strength, I had the power to reject sin.

I began to spend my time more meaningfully—doing daily chores, keeping active, and learning to appreciate life, nature, and even the trials that came my way. For the first time in a long while, I felt hope.

The seminar opened my eyes: I had been living without love—without a relationship with God. I now know that only through His love can I overcome. I follow Jesus because He first loved me, and through His sacrifice, I am saved. My obedience is no longer out of fear or formality, but out of love and devotion to Him. So, I committed again my life to Jesus and was baptized.

Today, I strive daily to resist the pull of my old life. When I feel weak, I turn to God in prayer and seek encouragement from fellow believers. My goal is to let Him shape me into a faithful servant, a true friend, and a living testimony of His grace. Each day, I pray for strength to live with purpose, meaning, and unwavering faith.

Through this experience, I found my return, my way back to God. I now walk with Him—not in fear, but in joy, faith, and love. Truly, His grace is greater than all my sins, and His mercy has given me a new beginning.

We no longer went to church, and I rarely prayed. My heart felt cold and distant from God.

I remember once seeing people worshiping joyfully in a nearby church. I did not know then it was a Seventh-day Adventist Church, but I wished I could join them. Some other churches invited me to worship with them, and I didhoping to learn more about God's Word. But somehow, I never found peace. Strange dreams even told me to stop attending, and I withdrew again into silence.

Then one day, God used my daughter to reach me. She had been invited to attend a children's program by some missionaries who gave her a flyer for a prophecy seminar. She excitedly told me there was also one for adults and encouraged me to come. Out of curiosity, I went —and that decision changed my life.

As I listened to the messages, I was amazed at the depth of God's Word. Each topic stirred my heart and gave me peace I had not felt in years. The truths I discovered during the seminar opened my eyes and assured me that God was leading me on the right path. It was something I had never experienced in other churches.

One of the biggest changes in my life was learning to truly connect with God. I no longer felt shy or awkward to pray. I began removing things from my home that were not in harmony with His truth—like the pictures of saints that once covered our walls. Now, I find joy in studying the Bible, attending worship, and following God's will each day.

But the journey was not without trials. Three times I backed out of baptism because of fear and family conflict. My husband grew angry as I continued attending the seminar. He even threatened to harm me and sent me away from our home with my youngest daughter. It was painful, but through the missionaries' encouragement, I realized that these were Satan's attempts to keep me from the truth. The more I was opposed, the more determined I became to surrender my life fully to Jesus.

Today, I have finally found peace and purpose in Christ. With God's help, I am committed to living by the truths I have learned and to invite my children to know Him too. I know that trials will still come, but I choose to trust and pray always. What once was a life of struggle has become a story of surrender—a story of how God's love found me and brought me home. ack in 2015, I was working as an I.T. professional in BGC, enjoying a stable job, a side hustle, and the means to live comfortably. Yet deep inside, I felt empty. My days fell into a dull cycle of commuting, working long hours, and unwinding with online games, drinking, or random hangouts. Even the Sabbath, once sacred to me, lost its meaning as my spiritual life slipped into neglect. Then one night, I came across a Facebook video about Sunday laws that seemed so real, it filled me with terror. Fear gripped me as I realized how far I had drifted from God. Depression and hopelessness soon followed as I wrestled with guilt, fearing my probation was already closed. That night I prayed desperately, pleading with God for one more chance. By morning, I discovered the video was just a movie trailer-but I knew God was giving me another opportunity to return to Him, and I promised never to go back to my old ways.

Taking the chance...

From that day, everything changed. I began reading the Bible and Spirit of Prophecy with renewed passion, watching sermons, and singing praises to God with joy I had not felt in

years. Eventually, I chose to be rebaptized, publicly recommitting my life to Him. I grew active in church ministries and started sharing the gospel with my coworkers, handing out books like The Great Controversy and Steps to Christ. As the call to ministry deepened, I made the difficult decision to resign from my job and serve God full-time, even though it meant letting go of financial privileges. Yet through every sacrifice, God has proven faithful, and I have found peace in knowing He cares for my family while sustaining me in this missionary calling. I am forever grateful that God gave me another chance.

Going further...

My journey into ministry began in 2016 with Batch 16 of LIGHT (Lay Institute for Global Health Training), where I felt a strong calling to dedicate my life fully to God's service. After graduating from LIGHT, I served as a lay worker in Nueva Ecija and later in Infanta, Pangasinan, where I shared God's Word, connected with the community, and supported others through natural remedies, which deepened my understanding of ministry and the value of faithful service. Later, God led me to PAFCOE,

where, after my training, I first worked behind the scenes as part of the kitchen staff during Batch 13. Eventually, I transitioned into the media team as a full-time volunteer in Batch 14 until now, where I used my skills in graphic design, front-end web development, and video editing to help spread the gospel through creative content. Though still a beginner, I am passionate about learning and growing my skills. I believe media is a powerful tool for soul-winning, reaching people who may never enter a church but can encounter Christ through testimonies online. At the same time, I get the privilege as well to go and conduct prophecy seminars with my co-missionaries.

A privilege experience...

Several years ago, during an evangelistic effort in Ilocos Sur, I met a devoted Catholic couple whose home was filled with altars and images of Mary. The husband, elderly and wheelchairbound, received daily treatments from ussimple exercises, water therapy, and massageswhile my partner gently shared the gospel during our visits. Over time, we witnessed both physical and spiritual transformation: the husband regained strength to walk and even climb their bamboo ladder, while the couple embraced Bible truths, accepted the Sabbath, discarded their idols and jewelry, and ultimately chose baptism. Not long after, the husband passed away, but with peace in Christ, leaving behind a powerful testimony of God's healing and saving grace. This experience reminded me





that our meeting was no accident, but part of God's plan, and I will forever treasure the privilege of being part of their journey.

Reassured choice...

I choose this missionary life because I believe with all my heart that God is coming soon, and the time we have left is too precious to waste on things that are temporary. While the world offers wealth, fame, and comfort, I have realized that nothing can replace the joy and fulfillment of serving in God's mission and helping lead people to Christ. Many of my peers have prospered in their careers and attained financial success, yet I have seen how often true joy is missing from their lives. For me, every soul reached and every life touched is worth far more than any material possession, for these are eternal treasures that no bank account can hold. Though I may not have the wealth of others, I am rich in faith, hope, love, and the assurance that I am working for a greater inheritance—an eternal one.

Thriving amidst Challenges...

Being away from family and friends during my missionary assignments in remote areas has often left me feeling lonely and out of place, surrounded by unfamiliar faces, cultures, and ways of life. Yet in those moments of isolation, God has taught me profound lessons about His love, reminding me through His promise, "I am with you alway," that I am never truly alone.

The joy of witnessing someone who once felt lost find hope and purpose in Christ outweighs every difficulty, trusting that success is not measured by my ability but by my faithfulness to His call.

Lessons along...

Through this experience, I have realized that missionary life is a calling to grow not only in faith and experience but also in love to those who are different, to love without expecting anything in return, and to trust that God is using me to plant seeds that will grow into something beautiful in His time. Even when I feel alone, I am reminded that God's mission is bigger than my feelings of loneliness or fear. He is with me, and He is with those I serve. I am part of something far greater than myself.

Committed to the chance...

What keeps me going as a missionary is the urgency and purpose of fulfilling God's calling. Life is short, and whether or not Christ returns in my generation, I am committed to sharing the everlasting gospel—the Three Angels' Messages—that brings hope and transforms lives. I do not worry about resources, for I trust in God's faithfulness to provide for His children.

I am deeply thankful for my family who supported my decision to become a full-time missionary, despite the uncertainties that came with it, and for friends whose passion for evangelism continues to inspire me to stay faithful in my calling. I am also grateful for the people around me who teach me valuable lessons in humility, kindness, patience, and godly character—reminders of what it truly means to live out my faith. Though I know His work in me is far from finished, I move forward with gratitude, joy, and trust in His plan.

To those faithfully working for the Lord despite life's challenges, I encourage you: let no obstacle or hardship keep you from fulfilling your calling. The trials you face are God's way of refining you for greater service, and every sacrifice—whether of time, energy, or resources—is never in vain but bears eternal fruit. In moments of weakness, His grace is sufficient, and His power is made perfect. Stay faithful, take your chance, keep pressing forward, and remember that your labor for the Lord matters. You are not alone—He walks with you, provides for you, and fills you with a joy and peace the world cannot offer.


